This from Jim -

Hi Pat, The book sure got there quick. Glad that you enjoyed it. Yes, it was written for therapy. Also Gouveia was my mother's fourth husband. He was a Sargent in the Air Force and we were stationed at Manston AFB in Kent. I have thought about re-writing it and expound more on my activities over there. The name of Bill has left my memory, but Ray Bernard I remember. His family lived in Ramsgate and town west of us. I met Ray about three years later. He had joined the Air Force and was going to school at Keesler AFB in Biloxi, MS where we were living at the time. He was married and still the same old cocky self. (Smile). When we talked about our escapades over there he had a memory laps so that was that and I have not seen him since.

My results from my polio were not very serious. My right leg is about an inch shorter than my left but I have learned to compensate for that. I play a lot of tennis and am very good at it. I have always been an athlete all my life and I contribute that to my speedy recovery, (4 yrs.) Also to the fact that I had a great team of doctors and medic's who worked with me. I Dated Kathy Brooks for a time but my attitude and playing around killed that in a hurry.

In closing as I said, I wrote the book for therapy and not for sale although I did sell some to a local bookstore. Due to the lack of pages it was told to me that it would not be a marketable book.

I am certain that if he had not been ill, I would have also been on that plane. In some ways I have always felt that I had to do a little more, try a little harder, because I survived and they did not.
