I was in London from 1958 - 1961 and would have been the class of 1962, which I completed in Sumter, SC. I went to Bushy Hall for the 9th grade and then boarded the bus to Bushy Park from Northwood with Lillian Phillips for the next two years. Lillian is my oldest friend (not chronologically) because we have been friends since we were 14! In April we went to New York together! We both attended the Atlanta reunion and caught up with a number of folks. I have been back to London twice. It has been like coming home both times. Last year in April I went over with another friend and we stayed on Queenstown Road out by Battersea.

London is changing I am afraid. There are hordes of people wearing black because that seems to be the official city outfit. If you go to

any restaurant, the chances of getting an English server are slim – the young people are from all over the world. The shops in the small towns are disappearing - the green grocer, butcher, and it makes me feel really sad to see those traditions disappear. The pick up shops with sweets, postage, odds and ends are still evident. Evidently there was a fracas concerning doing away with the double-decker buses but the big boys won out. Last year the taxis were changing to a variety of colors and the wonderful spacious traditional black jobs were also being replaced to some degree with foreign drivers of sedans. Six years ago when I revisited the first time, it was still all so very much England of our day.

What do I remember? Taking the USS America from New York and being in 2nd class (because Dad agreed to take the "lesser fare"), so the "snobs" in first class ignored me. I was very self conscious, completely miserable missing my boyfriend in Omaha and totally overwhelmed with the changes in my life. First year was Wembley Park in a huge old house with no central heat - nothing but a kerosene heater in the living room and a gas heater in my bedroom, which my dad would not let me burn with the door shut (and what teenager is going to leave the door open right next to the parent room!) Bushy Hall was trailers (my fingers froze in the classrooms) and dancing at lunch. Now that was great fun! Folks I remember - Sue Rigby and John Sakalaris, Erin and Susan Keefe, Beth Burton, Pam Harden, Lillian, George Birdsong who followed me from Omaha and told me all the torrid things my boyfriend was up to since I left, DJ Sallas, Mike Flener, Terry Hamick, Patty Jones, Virginia Ederington, Rae Jean Whipple to name a few.

Next year Bushy Park, the bus ride was probably the highlight of my day - What fun we had in the back with jokes, cards and

teasing – Buzz Kurtz, Jerry Bijold and Larry Blake (who became my boyfriend), Gail Hermannsen, Joe Svoboda (I have a wonderful picture of us at the Christmas prom at West Ruislip), Timmy Foxworth and Sandy McMillian, Mary Jane Mellenger and many others. Lillian and I and one other girl T-ped the Mellenger house and the dog trapped us at the base of a large tree. Her father was not too pleased. I remember my typing teacher who was having a romance with another teacher and they would flirt in the back of the class - smack, smack - while we tap - tap - tapped. My favorite teacher was Mr. (was this Mr. Dickinson)? who taught social studies. Sat crossed legged on top of his desk. He is credited with getting me on that track as a college major (History). I remember the Teen Club at West Ruislip - what would we have done without that! George Burson, Jim Love, Nicki Jones and Joe, Bud, Karen Thornbury who snatched up Mike Flener the moment I expressed an interest (but we remained great friends -all of us), Chip Delap who became a dorm student somewhere along the line, the proms and dances, music and pool - the pubs where I would get the hard cider and go around the block and "pass" for 13 or 18 for B Bardot movies depending on what was playing. I remember rushing downtown to catch the Music Man with Jim Roberts who took me to the Junior Prom. There was the fog so thick in the morning that I couldn't see in front of my face, the wonderful trips we took - to Paris, Oberammergau, Copenhagen, Italy. The worst time was the tragic plane crash in 60 that plowed into the clock tower in Munich Square and killed all of our students who were at the University Of Maryland on the way back to London for Christmas, my boyfriend Larry being one of them. That was a very difficult time and I was ready to go home.

For so many years I thought about folks, wondered where they were, and what they did. When I first discovered the Bushy Park

website I thought I would hyperventilate! It was a special time we had, with very special friends and wonderful memories.

As you have heard a thousand times, but it is worth repeating, you are doing a great job, Gary, putting together "Bushy Tales" ever month. And, of course, Patricia helps keep it

alive by her sleuthing around and finding new "lost" students from Central High.

Here it is the last days of July, but I thought I would pass on some details about my good health/bad health. According to the stethoscope and the blood tests, I am in great health, but if you could feel the pain I have had in my back over the past 3 months, you know that there has to be something wrong.

This week I had an appointment with a spinal specialist at the University of Washington Medical Center in Seattle for tests and a Cat-Scan on my back. The Cat-Scan shows that the T9 vertebra has a serious compression fracture that makes it look like it has been squeezed leaving mostly an outer shell of bone, but very little bone inside around the spinal cord. The spinal specialist and the oncologist, who replaced my left femur (which had cancer) just two years ago, want to go in and remove the crushed vertebra and test it to make sure that a new cancer is not the cause for the damage.

The process will encompass two operations separated by about a week. Both operations are considered serious and lengthy. I enter the UW Medical Center Hospital this coming Monday morning for a pre-op embolization process. The first operation will take place two days later on 6 August.

Initial recovery could take up to about 3 months, with full recovery allowing me to exercise and move normally may take up to a year. I would like to think that we can attend the Reunion in San Diego in October, but we will have to wait and see how I am feeling. If I can't make it to San Diego, we would love to host anyone who would like to take a detour on the way home and visit us in Seattle for a few days.

By the way, thanks to Patricia, I have had some wonderful e-mail conversations with Rik

Henslee, my buddy and classmate out of '58 whom I had not seen nor spoken to in 45 years. I really have been looking forward to seeing Rik and his wife Barbara in San Diego, but as I said, we will have to wait and see how I feel. It was while Rik and I were on our month-long bike trip around Europe during the summer of '57, that we got the idea to have our senior class trip to Brussels for the World's Fair. For all of those classmates who remember that year, we also arranged for a group of Belgian high school students to come to London for a week and stay in many of our homes. Later we impose upon them to stay in their homes during our visit to Brussels. What a great life!

I will keep you posted as to how I am doing...I am very optimistic, but then again, that is me.
