

Memories of Bushy

The male is Richard, "Dickie", Dickinson, British. He had the dubious pleasure of teaching me Latin at Bushy in '53. Who could forget that hair cut?

By the way, did anyone else find the US Military astonishingly liberal with high school credits when they transferred either to college or another high school? I took freshman Latin and French in my high school in New York City. Then because of parental abuse, I went to live with my sister and her Air Force husband. And suddenly was in England. (I had never been outside of NY before.) Mr. Farned, who was the first principal at Bushy, was principal at Brize Norton base and he decided, based on my school's early start at 8 and late release at 4, that I was a junior. At Brize we had a class of 5 or 6 high school kids studying French, Latin, and German...one class period -3 languages at the same time. Same Latin I book I had in NY. ("Britannia est insula. Italia paeninsula est.") Then on to Bushy and Mr. Dickinson. 'Deja vu all over again!', as Yogi said. Same Latin I book (Britannia est insula. Italia.... more than 50 years later, and I still remember the opening lesson.) You'd think by then I'd have aced that class, but I was

way more into the strangeness of dorm life, army life, and England to pay a lot of attention to a language you couldn't even gossip in.

When I went to college later in California, UCLA required 2 years of a high school language or 1 year at college level. Well, I knew Brize Norton and Mr. Dickinson were both Latin I. So I took a year of college Spanish. Only to find when my high school records made it from the great dungeon of governmental records that I had been given credit for Latin I, Latin II, and Latin III. AND French I, and French II! (from Brize Norton) On paper, at least I was a bloody linguist. 5 years of high school foreign language. Unfortunately "Britannia est insula" was about it for me. But, evidently, the higher powers in the military didn't believe in penalizing the students for the lack of classes offered to dependents. Anyone else come out looking good on paper? (Actually I wouldn't trade my year at Bushy Park for all the "enrichment" classes in the world. It was an education, an eye opener, and a wonder, which influenced my whole life..., for which I'm ever thankful.)

I recently ran across the Bushy Park Web Site and subsequently your Bushy Tales Newsletter. Boy was that neat reading about the other students' experiences and memories.

I attended Bushy Park my Junior (59-60) and Senior (60-61) years. My experiences at Bushy Park were life changing. I came from an over-protective environment, having only attended two schools from first grade through my sophomore year of high school in Tucson, AZ, to an eye-opening worldly scene at Central High. I came from the desert where it rarely rained, to England where it would rain weeks on end (or so it seemed). I lived in the dorms for the two years I was at Bushy and encountered people and situations that I will never forget. It helped me grow up faster than I would have otherwise.

I remember my first day at the dorms, having arrived on a Sunday from my home in Reading (my Dad was stationed at Greenham Common). "Sea of Love" was playing over and over on the 45 turntable. When I hear that song to this day it brings me back to that first day that a whole new world was opened up to me. After my junior year, our class was split in half due to the opening of Lakenheath High School. I lost most of my dorm friends as most of the kids in the dorms during the 59-60 school year ended up going to Lakenheath.

Among the things I remember about Bushy were the trips into Hampton Court, the Fog Days where you could not see your hand in front of your face, the study halls each night, the free for all rugby games in front of the dorm after study hall and before lights out, our field trips into London to see such things as Shakespeare at the Old Vic, my rugby team and the dorm dances. Yes there was school also. I remember my fine teachers, among them Edna Leigh, English, Frank Janusz, POD, Mr. Abell, Chemistry, Mr. Gunderson, Algebra, Mr. Malmo, Spanish, Mr. Monreal, Mechanical Drawing and Mr. Todd, Typing.

But most of all I remember my schoolmates. Sharon Painter, my first girl friend, my Junior year roommate, Garth Westcott and friend Richard Raucher. My Senior year room mates Paul Smarrella and John Wilber and later Tom Williams. I remember Linda Shaw came over to England on the same plane, and Anne Young and Hugh Moore were the leads in our Senior class play, "My Sister Eileen", I was one of the Portuguese sailors. I remember my homeroom "secretary" Jane Aitkens, who took notes for me.

After high school I joined the Army and then finally graduated from the University of Arizona in 1971, ten years after Bushy. I have been married to my lovely wife, Irene, for some 37 years now and we have four children

and two granddaughters. I have worked for the Department of Defense some 36 years and will retire in two more years.

As I am getting on in years, I tend to look back at my life experiences and always consider my years at Bushy to be among the best.
