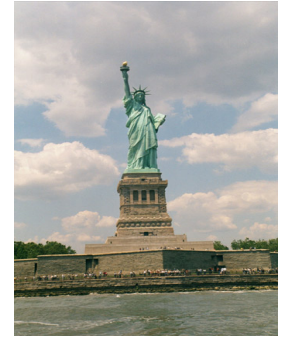

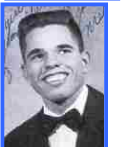

Blessed with a Bernina, gift of an abbey friend, he measures the monk, upon request, setting to the task.

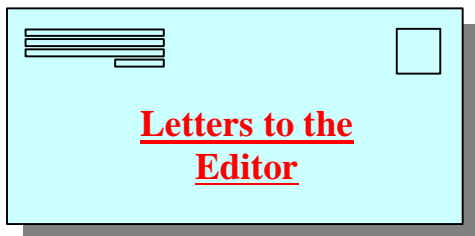
A serger trims the seam, encloses the edge of the fabric inside a thread casing, like a habit encloses a monk.
