

### MIGHTY BOBCATS TRAMPLE BITBURG 8-6

The Central High Bobcats came through with the first tackle football victory in CHS history by edging the Bitburg Barons 8-6 on Thursday afternoon, November 8.

Central scored their touchdown on the third play of the fourth quarter when fullback Tommy Freeman, who played a ~~the~~ game all day, dived over from the one yard line after the Bobcats had marched 52 yards in 11 plays. Quarterback George Birdsong was snowed under attempting to run the extra point.

Bitburg, who played a strong game themselves, scored first in the second quarter. Faced with a fourth and 13 situation on their own 14, quarterback Chuck Nielsen passed to Joey Butler, who caught the ball with three Barons around him and scampered 60 yards to paydirt. The play covered 86 yards in all and was the longest gaining play of the day. Bobcat linemen ~~steamed~~ steamed through to block the extra point try.

In the third quarter, Central marched 44 yards to the Bitburg two-yard line only to run out of gas and loose the ball on downs. Bitburg elected to gamble and run the ball, but CHS lineman Al Conrad rushed through and snuffed halfback Mike Riley in the endzone for a two point safety. These points were to be the deciding factor in the outcome of the game.

Bitburg almost pulled the game out of the fire when, with less than two minutes to play, Jack Williams picked off a partially blocked pass of George Birdsong's on his cont. page 10, column I

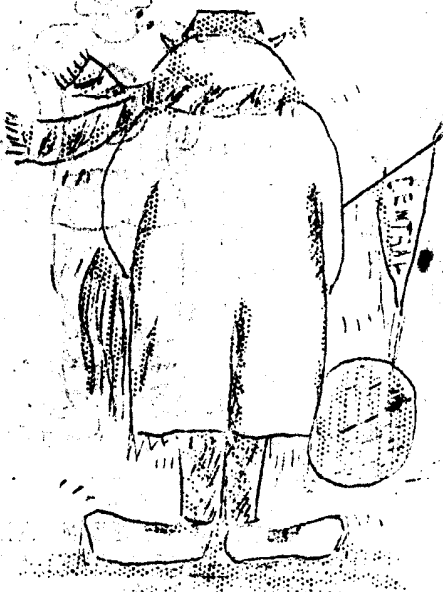
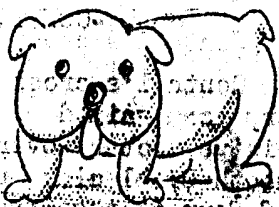

When told that "Gunner" was to appear in the paper, Coach Lewis said, "He'll enjoy that."

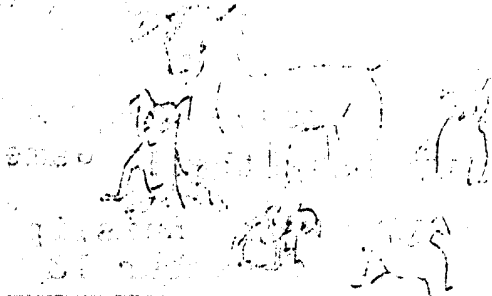


Danielson, Harper Lead
